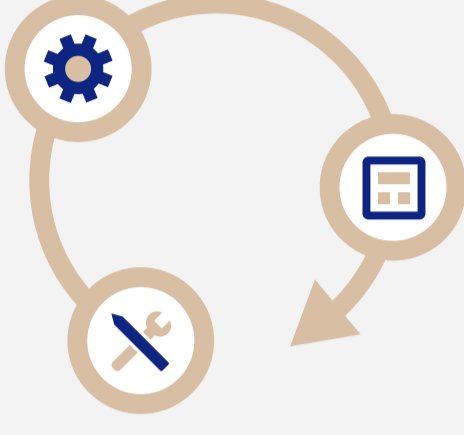


The State of Collaboration in the UK:
